Institut La Vertu is a school in Brussels, Belgium, affiliated with the French Ministry of Education (Wallonie-Bruxelles Enseignement). The language of instruction is French, but Flemish as a second language and English as a third are also included in the school curriculum. In addition to these, Arabic and Turkish lessons are given as extracurricular activities within the scope of the Programme d'Ouverture aux Langues et aux Cultures /OLC. With this aspect, Institut La Vertu is a multilingual school and therewithal, it is a multicultural school in terms of student profile.



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The number of students in the school is 295. The school building has a large library with a large area, an independent science laboratory, an indoor sports hall where more than one class can do sports at the same time, a large garden with a green area where basketball and volleyball fields can be created outside the school, besides a lot of places where students can take lessons comfortably.
